AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2010/02

**GALVANISED STEEL PIPE
EXPORTED FROM THAILAND**

**Finding in relation to
Continuation of anti-dumping measures**

The Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (Customs and Border Protection) has completed its inquiry into whether the continuation of anti-dumping measures applying to galvanised steel pipe exported from Thailand is justified.

The Minister for Home Affairs (the Minister) has considered Trade Measures Report No. 147 (Report 147) and has accepted Customs and Border Protection's recommendations.

The Minister has declared that he has decided not to take steps to secure the continuation of anti-dumping measures currently applying to galvanised steel pipe exported to Australia from Thailand. These measures will expire on 17 February 2010.

Notice of the Minister's decision was published in *The Australian* newspaper and the Commonwealth of Australia *Gazette* on 27 January 2010.

The reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the continuation inquiry are contained in Report 147.
