



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO.2010/45

Certain Clear Float Glass

Exported from the People's Republic of China, Indonesia and
Thailand

Termination of part of the investigation

CUSTOMS ACT 1901 – PART XV B

On 19 April 2010, the delegate of the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (Customs and Border Protection) initiated an investigation following an application lodged by CSR Viridian Limited, the sole manufacturer of certain clear float glass (CFG) in Australia. The application requested the publication of a dumping duty notice in respect of CFG exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China), Indonesia and Thailand.

The goods the subject of the application (the goods) is clear float glass in nominal thicknesses of 3-12mm.

As a result of Customs and Border Protection's investigation, the delegate of the CEO is satisfied that there has been dumping by Xinyi Ultrathin (Donguan) Co., Ltd., (Xinyi), a Chinese exporter, of the goods, but the dumping margin for Xinyi, when expressed as a percentage of the weighted average export price, is less than 2%.

In accordance with s.269TDA(1) of the *Customs Act 1901*, the delegate of the CEO has decided to terminate the investigation so far as it relates to Xinyi.

Public notification of the termination of the investigation so far as it relates to Xinyi was published in *The Australian* newspaper on 2 December 2010.

In making the decision to terminate, the delegate considered Xinyi's verified exporter submission, Xinyi's exporter visit report, submissions in response to the visit report and Statement of Essential Facts No. 159, and other relevant information.

Termination report no. 159A (TER 159A), which sets out reasons for the termination, including the material findings of fact or law upon which this

Public notification of the termination of the investigation so far as it relates to Xinyi has been published in *The Australian* newspaper on 2 December 2010.

Interested parties may request a review of the delegate's decision to terminate part of the investigation by lodging an application with the Trade Measures Review Officer (TMRO) in the approved form and manner within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
