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**AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO 2010/11**

**CERTAIN ALUMINIUM EXTRUSIONS EXPORTED TO AUSTRALIA FROM  
THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA**

**Termination of part of the investigation into alleged  
dumping and subsidisation**

*Customs Act 1901 (Cth) – Part XV B*

On 24 June 2009 the Chief Executive Officer of Customs and Border Protection (CEO) initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of certain aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China). The investigation was initiated following an application lodged by Capral Limited (Capral) on behalf of the Australian industry producing like goods.

Public notification of initiation of the investigation was made on 24 June 2009 in *The Australian* newspaper and by Australian Customs Dumping Notice (ACDN) 2009/20 which also contains additional information regarding the goods.

As a result of the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service's (Customs and Border Protection) investigation, the delegate of the CEO is satisfied that the dumping margin for Tai Ao Aluminium (Taishan) Co Ltd (Tai Ao) is less than two per cent. The delegate of the CEO is also satisfied that the countervailable subsidisation is not more than two per cent.

In accordance with s.269TDA(1) and (2) of the *Customs Act 1901 (Cth)* the delegate of the CEO has decided to terminate the investigations so far as they relate to Tai Ao.

In making the decision to terminate, the delegate of the CEO considered submissions and information supplied by the applicant, Tai Ao and other interested parties. The delegate also considered submissions in response to the Statement of Essential Facts No 148 published on 1 March 2010 and other relevant information.

The investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of the goods from China by exporters other than Tai Ao will continue. Customs and Border Protection is due to report to the Minister for Home Affairs in respect of this investigation by 15 April 2010.

A notice of the decision to terminate was published in *The Australian* on 14 April 2010. A termination report is available on Customs and Border Protection's website.

Interested parties may request a review of the CEO's decision by lodging an application with the Trade Measures Review Officer (TMRO) in the approved form and manner within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
