



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2009/22

**Certain toilet paper exported from
the People's Republic of China and the Republic of Indonesia
Reinvestigation of dumping findings**

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

The Attorney General has requested the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (Customs and Border Protection) to reinvestigate all findings made in *Trade Measures Report No. 138* of 16 December 2009. This report was in relation to the alleged dumping of certain toilet paper exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China and the Republic of Indonesia.

The request arose from the Trade Measures Review Officer's (TMRO) review of the former Minister for Home Affairs' decision to publish a notice under s. 269TG(2) of the *Customs Act 1901*. Notice of the review was given on 20 March 2009. There were eight review applicants to the TMRO.

The Attorney General has requested that the CEO of Customs and Border Protection report the result of the reinvestigation to him by 31 December 2009. In conducting the reinvestigation, the CEO of Customs and Border Protection must only have regard to the information and conclusions to which the TMRO was permitted to have regard.
