



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO.2009/23

Reinvestigation of findings

Customs and Border Protection is currently undertaking reinvestigations regarding Processed Dried Currants exported from Greece (see ACDN 2009/19) and Toilet Paper exported from the People's Republic of China and the People's Republic of Indonesia (see ACDN 2009/22). The following is provided for the information of all interested parties.

Clarification of procedure for reinvestigations

The officers conducting these reinvestigations will not be those that undertook the original investigation.

The Chief Executive Officer is required to conduct reinvestigations in accordance with the Minister's (or in the case of toilet paper, the Attorney-General's) requirements and as such must only have regard to the information and conclusions to which the Trade Measures Review Officer (Review Officer) was permitted to have regard. No new information or conclusions may be considered in a reinvestigation. A non-confidential version of all information that will be considered is in the public domain and is available to interested parties through the public record of the investigations or the public record of the review maintained by the Review Officer.

There is no legislative requirement to maintain a public record, or to publish a Statement of Essential Facts (SEF), in a reinvestigation. As such, Customs and Border Protection will not be maintaining a public record for these reinvestigations, nor will it be publishing a SEF prior to reporting the results of these reinvestigations to the Minister (in the case of Processed Dried Currants) or the Attorney General (in the case of Toilet Paper).
