



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2009/17

Implementation of Joint Study Recommendation

Internet Based Anti-Dumping and Countervailing Public Record

On 24 November 2006 the outcome of the Joint Study Report on the Administration of Australia's Anti-Dumping System foreshadowed a number of changes to the system's administration. Information on the Joint Study is available at <http://customs.gov.au>.

One recommended change was that Customs make public file records available to interested parties on its website.

The Chief Executive Officer of Customs (CEO) must maintain a public record in relation to each anti-dumping or countervailing application that leads to an investigation, review or inquiry. The public record contains non-confidential information including submissions from interested parties, the statement of essential facts compiled in respect of the investigation, review or inquiry, and relevant correspondence between the CEO and other persons. All interested parties to an investigation, review or inquiry are entitled to inspect the public record.

The electronic public record has been established and access can be gained by completing the user registration form at the web address <http://customs.gov.au>, under the anti-dumping option.
