



## **AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2005/65**

### **Ammonium nitrate from the Russian Federation - Continuation Inquiry and review of anti dumping measures - extension of time granted to issue the Statements of Essential Facts**

On 15 September 2005 the Australian Customs Service (Customs) published initiation notices for a continuation inquiry and review of anti-dumping measures in respect of ammonium nitrate exported to Australia from Russia.

The initiation notices advised that the statements of essential facts would be placed on the public record by 3 January 2006. The statements of essential facts sets out the facts on which Customs proposes to base its recommendations to the Minister.

Customs has experienced delays in obtaining and verifying relevant information required for its assessments on export price and normal value data. Consequently, Customs is unable to meet the deadline for publication of the statements.

The Minister has, under s. 269ZHI of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline. The statements will now be placed on the public record on or before 4 March 2006. Customs will make every effort to publish the statements at an earlier date if possible.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to Customs in response to the statement within 20 days of that statement being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Minister will be made in a report due on or before 18 April 2006.
