



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2006/08

COPPER TUBE

EXPORTED FROM THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA

Revocation of anti-dumping measures

Section 269ZDB of the *Customs Act 1901*

A review of anti-dumping measures applying to exports of certain copper tube exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea (Korea) (referred to in this notice as “the goods”) commenced on 10 August 2005.

The Minister for Justice and Customs (Minister) has considered Trade Measures report number 102 (TM 102) and any other information he considered relevant. The Minister has declared, to the extent that the anti-dumping measures concerning the goods involved the publication of a dumping duty notice that, with effect from 22 March 2006, the dumping duty notice is to be taken to be revoked in relation to the goods. The reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the review are contained in TM 102.

A notice has been published in the *Gazette* and *The Australian* newspaper on 22 March 2006 and applies to those goods from Korea entered for home consumption on and after 22 March 2006.
