



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2006/12

Split system caravan air conditioners exported from Italy - expiry of measures

On 27 May 2005 the Australian Customs Service (Customs) published a notice in *The Australian* in relation to the expiry of anti-dumping measures applying to split system caravan air conditioners exported from Italy. This notice invited those persons as specified at section 269ZHB(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* to apply to Customs for the continuation of the anti-dumping measures by 26 July 2005.

The anti-dumping measures were initially imposed on 20 April 2001 following Ministerial consideration of Trade Measures Report No. 32.

As Customs received no application for the continuation of the anti-dumping measures, the anti-dumping measures on split system caravan air conditioners exported from Italy will expire on 20 April 2006. Therefore on and from that day anti-dumping measures will no longer apply.
