



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2006/19

Ammonium nitrate exported from the Russian Federation - continuation and review of anti-dumping measures

The Australian Customs Service (Customs) has completed a continuation inquiry and review of anti-dumping measures applying to exports of ammonium nitrate, prilled, granular or in other solid form, with or without additives or coatings, in packages exceeding 10 kg (referred to in this notice as “the goods”), exported to Australia from the Russian Federation (Russia).

The Minister for Justice and Customs (Minister) has considered Trade Measures Reports Nos. 104 & 105 and has accepted Customs’ recommendations. The Minister has declared that with effect from the date of publication of the notice of his decision that the measures currently applying to the goods will be altered. The Minister has also declared that he has decided to take steps to secure the continuation of anti-dumping measures currently applying to the goods exported to Australia from Russia, which would have otherwise expired on 24 May 2006. The reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the continuation inquiry and review are contained in Trade Measures Reports Nos. 104 & 105.

Notices have been published in the *Gazette* and *The Australian* newspaper on 17 May 2006 and apply to those goods from Russia entered for home consumption on and after 17 May 2006.
