



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2006/21

Clear float glass Exported from the Republic of Indonesia Expiry of anti-dumping measures

On 15 July 2005 the Australian Customs Service (Customs) published a notice in *The Australian* in relation to the expiry of anti-dumping measures in the form of a price undertaking, applying to exports of clear float glass (CFG) by PT Muliaglass from the Republic of Indonesia. This notice invited those persons as specified at section 269ZHB(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* to apply to Customs for the continuation of the anti-dumping measures by 13 September 2005.

The anti-dumping measures were initially imposed following Ministerial consideration of Trade Measures Report No. 21 and Ministerial acceptance of a price undertaking on 28 May 2001.

Customs received an application for the continuation of anti-dumping measures from Pilkington (Australia) Pty Ltd and on 14 October 2005 a continuation investigation was initiated. Customs was not satisfied that the expiration of PT Muliaglass' price undertaking would lead, or be likely to lead, to a continuation of, or a recurrence of, the dumping and the material injury that the anti-dumping measure is intended to prevent. Accordingly, Customs recommended that the anti-dumping measures expire on the specified expiry date. Customs findings of the investigation are detailed in Trade Measures Report No. 106, which is available on the Customs website at www.customs.gov.au.

The Minister accepted Customs recommendations and decided not to secure the continuation of the anti-dumping measures applicable to exports of clear float glass from the Republic of Indonesia by PT Muliaglass. The notice of the Minister's decision was published in *The Australian* and the *Gazette* on 8 May 2006.

As a result, PT Muliaglass is to be released from the undertaking and the investigation that gave rise to the undertaking will be terminated from the specified expiry date of 28 May 2006. Therefore, on and from that day anti-dumping measures will no longer apply.
