



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2006/24

Certain mobile garbage bins Exported from Malaysia

Finding in relation to a dumping investigation

The Minister for Justice and Customs has accepted Customs' recommendations in relation to the alleged dumping of Mobile Garbage Bins, assembled or unassembled, of 120 litre and 240 litre nominal capacities, exported from Malaysia (the goods).

In Report No. 108 Customs concluded that:

- exports of the goods from Malaysia were at dumped prices;
- the Australian industry producing like goods had suffered material injury as a result of those dumped goods; and
- material injury would continue to be caused to Australian industry if the goods from Malaysia continue to be exported to Australia at dumped prices.

Customs recommended that anti-dumping action be taken against the goods exported from Malaysia.

The Minister has declared that s. 8 of the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* applies to certain mobile garbage bins:

- under s. 269TG(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), in respect of the goods and like goods exported to Australia after 27 February 2006, to the extent permitted by s. 269TN of the Act, by all exporters from Malaysia;
- under s. 269TG(2) of the Act, in respect of like goods exported to Australia after the date of publication of this notice, by all exporters from Malaysia;

Measures will apply after 27 February 2006, which is the date from which Customs determined that securities would be collected for certain mobile garbage bins entered for home consumption pursuant to Preliminary Affirmative Determination No. 108. The notice of the Minister's decision was published in *The Australian* newspaper and *Gazette* on 5 June 2006.

Report No. 108, which contains the reasons for Customs' recommendation, will be sent to all interested parties that participated in the investigation. Bona fide importers of the goods may obtain confidential information on the measures contained in the Confidential Instructions by contacting their regional dumping liaison officer.

Interested parties may request a review of the Minister's decision by lodging an application for review with the Trade Measures Review Office in the approved form and manner within 30 days of 5 June 2006. The legislation relating to the review of ministerial decisions is set out in the Act commencing at s. 269ZZA.
