



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2006/28

Bottled brandy exported from France - expiry of anti-dumping measures

Anti-dumping measures on bottled brandy exported from France were initially imposed on 28 June 2001 following Ministerial consideration of Trade Measures Report No. 40.

On 15 August 2005 the Australian Customs Service (Customs) published a notice in *The Australian* in relation to the expiry of those anti-dumping measures. That notice invited those persons as specified at section 269ZHB(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* to apply to Customs for the continuation of the anti-dumping measures by 14 October 2005.

As Customs received no application for the continuation of the anti-dumping measures, the anti-dumping measures applicable to bottled brandy exported from France will expire on 27 June 2006. Therefore on and from that day anti-dumping measures will no longer apply.
