



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2006/31

Clear Float Glass The People's Republic of China Finding in relation to a review of anti-dumping measures

The Australian Customs Service has completed its review of the normal values and non-injurious free on board prices (NIFOBs) relating to the anti-dumping measures applying to exports of certain clear float glass (CFG) exported from the People's Republic of China (China). The review commenced on 16 November 2005.

The goods the subject of the anti-dumping measures are CFG in nominal thicknesses from 3mm to 12mm (actual thickness 2.8mm to 12.3mm), classified within Tariff Item 7005.29.00 in Schedule 3 to the *Customs Tariff Act 1995* exported to Australia from China.

Recommendations resulting from that review, reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and the evidence relied on in relation to the review are contained in Trade Measures Report No. 109.

The Minister for Justice and Customs has accepted Customs' recommendations and as a result the normal values and NIFOBs applying to exports of certain CFG exported from China have been re-ascertained. A notice announcing the results of the review was published in *The Australian* newspaper on 9 August 2006.

The revised normal values and NIFOBs will apply to the goods entered for home consumption by Saint-Gobain Hanglas Qingdao on and after 1 March 2006. Revised normal values and NIFOBs for Qinghuangdao Yaohua Glass Co., Ltd will apply to the goods entered for home consumption on and after 9 August 2006. Revised NIFOBs for all remaining exporters subject to measures will also apply on and after 9 August 2006. Certain CFG exported from China by Luoyang Glass Co. are not subject to measures.

Normal values and NIFOBs will not be published as they may reveal confidential information. Bona fide importers of the goods can obtain details of the revised levels from the Regional Dumping Liaison Officer in their respective capital city.
