



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2006/34

Certain Clear Laminated Safety Glass From The People's Republic of China and The Republic of Indonesia

Extension of time for the publication of the statement of essential facts

The Minister for Justice and Customs has, under s. 269ZHI of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline for the publication of the statement of essential facts in relation to the investigation of alleged dumping of certain clear laminated safety glass exported from the People's Republic of China and the Republic of Indonesia.

The deadline has been extended due to the large number of interested parties participating in the investigation. Interested parties have had difficulty in providing timely information to Customs.

The investigation commenced on 25 May 2006. Customs gave notice of the initiation of the investigation in *The Australian* newspaper and Australian Customs Dumping Notice 2006/15.

A statement of essential facts was to be placed on the public record by 12 September 2006. The statement of essential facts must now be placed on the public record by 22 October 2006.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions in response to the statement of essential facts within 20 days of its placement on the public record.
