



**AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2006/46**

**Transparent bi-axially oriented polypropylene exported  
from the Republic of Indonesia**

**Extension of time for the publication of the statement of  
essential facts in relation to an anti-dumping  
investigation**

The Minister for Justice and Customs has, under s. 269ZHI of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline for the publication of the statement of essential facts in relation to the investigation into the alleged dumping of transparent bi-axially oriented polypropylene (BOPP) exported from the Republic of Indonesia (Indonesia).

The deadlines have been extended to give interested parties in both Australia and Indonesia sufficient time to respond to the investigation.

The anti-dumping investigation was initiated on 24 August 2006. Customs gave notice of the investigation in *The Australian* newspaper and in Australian Customs Dumping Notice 2006/36. A statement of essential facts was to be placed on the public record by 12 December 2006. The statement must now be placed on the public record by 23 January 2007.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions in response to the statement of essential facts within 20 days of their placement on the public record. A recommendation to the Minister will be made in a report due on or before 9 March 2007.
