



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2006/58

Polyvinyl Chloride Homopolymer resin exported from the United States of America - finding in relation to continuation of anti-dumping measures

The Australian Customs Service has completed its continuation inquiry for anti-dumping measures applying to polyvinyl chloride homopolymer resin (hereafter referred to as the goods) exported to Australia from the United States of America (USA).

The Minister for Justice and Customs has considered Trade Measures Report No 115 and has accepted Customs' recommendations.

The Minister has declared that he has decided to take steps to secure the continuation of anti-dumping measures currently applying to the goods exported to Australia from the USA, which would have otherwise expired on 22 January 2007.

Notice of the Minister's decision was published in the *Gazette* and *The Australian* newspaper on 30 November 2006.

The reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the continuation inquiry are contained in Trade Measures Report No 115.
