



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2008/11

Dichlorophenoxy-acetic acid (2,4-D)

Exported from the United Kingdom

Expiry of anti-dumping measures

Anti-dumping measures applicable to dichlorophenoxy-acetic acid (2,4-D) exported from the United Kingdom were initially imposed by public notice on 24 March 2003 following Ministerial consideration of Trade Measures Report No. 58.

On 19 April 2007 the Australian Customs Service (Customs) published a notice in *The Australian* in relation to the expiry of those anti-dumping measures. That notice invited those persons as specified at section 269ZHB(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* to apply for the continuation of the anti-dumping measures by 18 June 2007.

As Customs received no application for the continuation of the anti-dumping measures applicable to dichlorophenoxy-acetic acid (2,4-D) exported from the United Kingdom, those measures will expire on 24 March 2008. Therefore, on and from 25 March 2008 anti-dumping measures will no longer apply.
