



AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2006/13

A4 Insert ring binders

Exported from Malaysia

Finding in relation to continuation inquiry

The Australian Customs Service (Customs) has completed its inquiry into whether the anti-dumping measures currently applying to imports of A4 insert ring binders from Malaysia should be continued for a further five years. Customs' findings are detailed in Trade Measures Report No. 107.

Customs was not so satisfied that expiration of the measures applying to exports of A4 insert ring binders from Malaysia would lead, or would be likely to lead, to a continuation of, or a recurrence of, the dumping and the material injury that the anti-dumping measures are intended to prevent.

Accordingly, Customs recommended to the Minister that the anti-dumping measures expire on the specified expiry date of 13 June 2006. Therefore on and from that date anti-dumping measures will no longer apply.

The Minister has accepted these recommendations and decided not to take steps to secure the continuation of the anti-dumping measures applying to A4 insert ring binders exported from Malaysia. The notice of the Minister's decision was published in *The Australian* and the *Gazette* on 28 April 2006.
