



## **AUSTRALIAN CUSTOMS DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2006/43**

### **PINEAPPLE FRUIT EXPORTED FROM THAILAND**

#### **Continuation and review of anti-dumping measures**

The Australian Customs Service has completed continuation inquiries and reviews of anti-dumping measures applying to:

- pineapple fruit prepared or preserved in containers not exceeding one litre (consumer pineapple) exported to Australia from Thailand; and
- pineapple fruit prepared or preserved in containers exceeding one litre (food service and industrial pineapple) exported to Australia from Thailand.

#### **The continuation inquiry**

The Minister for Justice and Customs has considered Trade Measures report 110 and has accepted Customs' recommendations.

The Minister has declared that he has decided to take steps to secure the continuation of anti-dumping measures currently applying to the goods exported to Australia from Thailand, which would have otherwise expired on 17 October 2006.

Notice of the Minister's decision was published in the *Gazette* and *The Australian* newspaper on 10 October 2006.

The reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the continuation inquiry are contained in Trade Measures report 110.

#### **The review**

The Minister for Justice and Customs has considered Trade Measures report 111 and has accepted Customs' recommendations.

The Minister has declared that with effect from the date of publication of the notice of his decision that the anti-dumping measures currently applying to the goods will be altered.

Notice of the Minister's decision was published in the *Gazette* and *The Australian* newspaper on 10 October 2006. The revised measures will apply to those goods from Thailand entered for home consumption on and after 10 October 2006.

To preserve confidentiality, the revised measures will not be published. Bona fide importers of the goods can obtain details of the new rates from the Regional Dumping Liaison Officer in their respective capital city.

The reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the review are contained in Trade Measures report 111.
